5 Post-HS Options

Junior year is an important year to prep for your next step in life!



4-Year University

- Transcript:
 - **Standard Diploma** is required
 - **GPA:** Most schools require a minimum 3.0
 - **Cs or above** for core/academic classes
 - **World Language** credits (2 of the same!)
 - **Algebra 2** or above for math level
 - **16 Academic Credits**
 - Don't slack off this year or next!
 - 15 credits is required for graduation
 - Next semester is the last semester of grades that will go on your transcript before you apply!

Transcript Reminders

- **SAT:**
 - New format
 - Focuses on content aimed at college and career readiness
 - Has no “SAT vocab” words (but still challenging vocab using context)
 - Math that applies to a variety of careers
 - 3 sections: Evidence-Based Reading & Writing, Math, Essay (optional)
 - 3 hours (Re/Ma) + 50 min (essay)
 - Scored from 400-1600 (Re/Ma) + Essay (2-8)
- **ACT:**
 - English, math, reading and science
 - Related to what you have learned in HS
 - 2 hours 55 min (Re/Ma) + 40 min (essay)
 - Score of 1-36 (writing 2-12)
- **FYI: PSAT scores from October 19th:**
 - Scores will be available after Winter Break

- Public vs. Private Colleges: Share one thing you know about each option

Think, Pair, Share

Public University

- Tuition: More affordable
- Out-of-state tuition applies
- GPA requirement in 2.75-3.50 range
- Tend to be bigger campuses/student bodies
- Due to larger size, more options are available

Private University

- Tuition: More expensive
- Out-of-state tuition does not apply
- More financial aid is available
- Usually a higher GPA is recommended or required
- Tend to be smaller campuses/student bodies
- Not always as many opportunities/options

Public vs. Private Colleges

- Great time over Winter and Spring Break or summer!
- See/experience the campus, stay in the dorms, meet current students

People who earn a 4-year Bachelor's Degree make an average of **\$1 million** more in their lifetime than those with only a HS diploma!

College/Campus Visits



2-Year/Community College

- 2+ years
- Modified or Standard Diploma, Undocumented students – all ok!
- No GPA requirement
- No World Language credits required
- **Placement Tests**
 - Reading, Writing, Math are required
 - Can use SAT/ACT scores in place of, as well
 - Grades of C or higher from core classes in high school can be used for placement as well

Admission Requirements

- University Transfer Degree vs. Associates Degree
 - **Transfer**: take basic core for about 2 years in preparation for 4-year university
 - **Associates**: Particular set of classes to complete a degree
- Many 3 or 6-month programs offered
 - Called Career Pathways at PCC
 - Examples: HVAC, Corrections Technicians, Bookkeeper, 911 Dispatcher,, Pharmacy Technician, Food Service
- Common Programs for 2-year schools:
 - Auto Body, Auto Mechanics, Nursing, Dental Assisting, Business/Accounting

Programs and Options

- Free tuition for up to 90 credits
- Any of the 17 Oregon community colleges
- Must have a 2.5+ GPA by graduation
- Would allow you to receive a 4-year Bachelor's degree (after transferring) for the price of 2 years!

Trade/Vocational Programs

- Shorter Programs
 - Enter workforce quickly
- Specific job training and career skills
 - Certificate/License
 - **Apprenticeship:** usually on-the-job training or going to school while working.
- Common Programs:
 - Massage, Cosmetology
 - Pipe Fitting, Plumber, Carpentry
 - Electrician, Heavy Equipment Operator
 - Culinary
 - Diesel Mechanic, Auto Detailing/Painting

Details



Military

- 5 Branches:
 - Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, Navy
 - Each has a unique purpose/"feel" to it
- Must have **Standard** Diploma
 - Modified Diploma and GED are not accepted
- Must take ASVAB test:
 - FREE at Glencoe on Thursday, Feb 2nd.
 - Sign up in the counseling center with Mrs. Pate
- Benefits include tuition coverage, career/technical training, food/housing aid

Employment

- Finding work can be difficult!
- Work Skills needed:
 - Timeliness, regular attendance
 - Able to learn new tasks and perform well
 - Work well with other people and bosses
 - Be eager to learn
 - Willing to accept responsibility
- Use of your transcript and/or references
